

Qualified teachers for southwest metro schools

Shown is the percentage of core academic courses at each middle and high school taught by a teacher deemed "highly qualified" under a federally mandated standard. The chart compares the rates from spring 2005 with the rates from a year earlier. It also shows the breakdown for spring 2005 by subject area. To be highly qualified, a teacher must demonstrate knowledge of the subject area by completing college coursework or passing a standardized test.
